 11:00 AM Children's Service— Interactive Prayer Stations. Join us as we walk as Jesus did through Holy Week.
 - 7:30 PM Service A service that moves from light to darkness as we reflect on the meaning of Christ's last hours and words, His suffering and death. The nursery will be staffed.
- ~ Easter Morning Worship April 12 8:30 and 10:45 AM Celebrate the resurrection and the promise of new life.
- ~ *Easter Breakfast 9:15-10:30 AM.* A special tradition at Holy Spirit is the gathering of the community for breakfast between services on Easter morning. Last year's crowd enjoyed meeting friends both old and new.

A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we enter into the season of Lent and proceed to that sacred time we call Holy Week, I pray that you will enter into a time of reflection and consideration of your life in faith. The two primary emphases in Lent are to consider our human condition, including sin and its deadly consequences for both individuals and society, and to consider the new possibilities offered to us in Jesus Christ and their implications for practical living. Both involve a sense of repentance, acknowledging the bare truth of our situation, but also offering an opportunity for change, for turning or returning to a life of peace, love, and grace.

In these weeks of Lent, one of the themes that is often presented is how God is always doing something new. The prophet Isaiah writes, "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:18-19) God is about making a new way, providing a fresh start, encouraging us to look at the world from a new and different perspective, from God's perspective.



When Jesus met the Samaritan woman at the well (John 4:4-42), he offered her water like she had never experienced before. The woman at first was caught up in the social mores and rules that all lived by. Then she had to overcome her concrete and human understanding of things to capture the new possibilities that Jesus was introducing to her. Eventually the woman embraced the Holy Spirit that Jesus was providing, the "Living Water" so that she may never be thirsty again. Jesus brings new life, reconciliation with God, and true, life-transforming change. And Jesus is inviting us into that new life as well.

Like the woman at the well, we must be open to what may feel like the invitation of a stranger to take a step out in faith. Like the woman at the well, we must be willing to look at things from a different perspective, to even cast away some of our established judgments about things, people, organizations. Like the woman at the well, we must be able to let go of some of our self-serving and stubborn convictions, in order to let God reconstruct us and guide us to a new way. For only then can we celebrate like the woman at the well, that there is one, who knows everything we have ever done. Only then can we experience the freedom and joy that comes with new life in the Spirit, and only then can we truly claim our Lord Jesus to be Savior of the world.

As we prepare to celebrate Christ risen from the dead, Christ's victory over sin, death, and the devil, let us celebrate his presence in our lives as well. And let's celebrate the life he gives us, for Jesus calls us each by our name. He calls us to be his beloved disciples. He calls us to follow him so that we can do something beautiful with our lives. He calls us to be transformed into the new possibilities, the new life he has prepared for us. He calls us to be awakened to the miracle of Christ's resurrection and to proclaim the Good News to all.

May you experience the joy of new life this Lenten season that only comes through Christ.


Book Club


Stoner by John Williams

March 27 at 7:30 PM

William Stoner is born at the end of the nineteenth century into a dirt-poor Missouri farming family. Sent to the state university to study agronomy, he instead falls in love with English literature and embraces a scholar's life, so different from the hardscrabble existence he has known. And yet as the years pass, Stoner encounters a succession of disappointments: marriage into a "proper" family estranges him from his parents; his career is stymied; his wife and daughter turn coldly away from him; a transforming experience of new love ends under threat of scandal. Driven ever deeper within himself, Stoner rediscovers the stoic silence of his forebears and confronts an essential solitude.

John Williams' luminous and deeply moving novel is a work of quiet perfection. William Stoner emerges from it not only as an archetypal American, but as an unlikely existential hero, standing, like a figure in a painting by Edward Hopper, in stark relief against an unforgiving world.

COOL Updates

First off, I would like to introduce myself. My name is Don Hanigan, and I am the new member of the Board of Directors for COOL (Christian Outreach of Lutherans) Ministries as a representative of our church. I have taken over for Larry Neumann, who had been a member of the board for five years. Also working on behalf of COOL through LCHS are Pam and Joe Labellarte, which I am sure most of you are aware. Pam and Joe have been organizing food drives and fund-raising activities for many years, and Joe was a board member for 10 years prior to handing the responsibilities over to Larry.

While I assume that most of you are familiar with COOL through the various activities organized within Holy Spirit, I wanted to share some information with you to ensure you are aware of the scope of COOL's outreach. Besides providing food to families in need in Lake County, COOL also provides transitional housing through the **Family Housing Program** and additional aid to veterans in need through the **Veterans Assistance Program**.

Last year, the COOL food pantry provided over 1 million pounds of food to families in Lake County. COOL also provided safe and comfortable housing for 21 families, as well as assistance to those who moved into new homes upon graduation from the program. Additionally, COOL was able to provide assistance to over 130 veterans in the area. This was a tremendous accomplishment, and was made possible partially due to the generosity of Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit and our congregation.

As I mentioned, I am sharing this information with you to make sure you are aware of how much of an impact COOL has for many families and individuals in the Lake County area. We will continue to reach out to you as a congregation for donations as the need for these types of services is always there. We will also be sending out an update in the near future about the many volunteer opportunities that arise throughout the year. Highlights from February 2020

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on February 10th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$25,589 for January (YTD total is \$25,589). Operating expenses were \$34,700 in January (YTD total is \$34,700).

The Pastor's report: Pastor Tim and Laurie are working on confirming the congregation's membership roster. Kathy Roderer will be hired as permanent accompanist. The April Church Council meeting will be held on April 20. Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Youth reported that the Youth did an outstanding job with the Youth Service and raised \$820 for Feed My Starving Children/Souper Bowl of Caring. Youth are encouraged to participate in Mardi Gras and the Youth-led Lenten service on April 1. Worship & Music reported that temporary accompanists are arranged until Kathy Roderer joins as permanent accompanist. There will be one service at 9:30 am on February 23 for Jazz Service. Lenten suppers will begin March 4; if interested in hosting a meal, please contact Nancy Fencl. Christian Education is running smoothly. Mardi Gras will be an intergenerational event, on Sunday February 23 after the service, with breakfast and fun for all ages. VBS planning is underway. CUFF reported Trivia Night on February 21. Corned beef and cabbage will be held on March 13. **Finance** reported that the mortgage interest rate adjusted down, and the letter of credit is in the process of being renewed. Human Needs reported that a blood drive will be held in March. Long-Range Planning reported that the committee continues its work on discussion and implementation of the congregation's mission and strategy, preparation of a task force mission statement, and inclusion of a cross-section of the congregation. Personnel reported that annual staff salary increases have been effectuated. Property reported that maintenance tasks and snow plowing as needed are ongoing. **Stewardship** reported that a proof has been prepared for the offering card. Barry Nelson will present a tutorial on the tax benefits of donor advised funds and also insights on electronic giving on March 1 between services. Old Business: The Sanctuary Enhancement Task Force continued its work in assessing flooring options and costs, as well as seating configurations and the sound system. A Brigid Cantagallo memorial is being prepared. New Business: The congregation is signed up for the Buffalo Grove Pride Parade on June 7. Delegates for Synod Convention June 5-6 are needed; see Pastor Tim if interested. Volunteers are needed for the Capital Campaign team and Progressive Dinner team. LCHS will be joining Amazon Smile-more information about sign-up to follow.

Next council meeting is March 9th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.


Snow Removal
