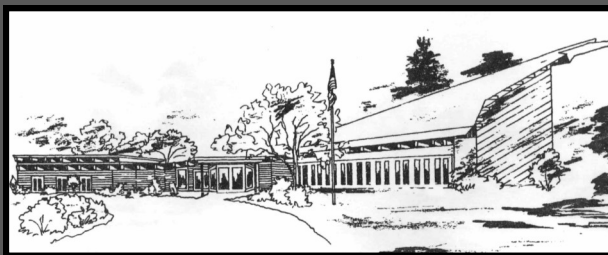

These ashes are used in this service of penitence, as they have been for centuries, as preparation for the road to Jerusalem and Christ's crucifixion. 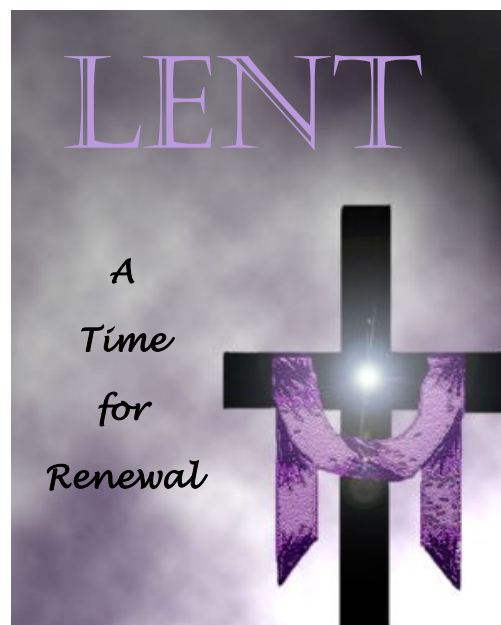
### MID-WEEK LENTEN WORSHIP SERVICES

The scenes of Lent are familiar. The upper room, the garden of Gethsemane, the halls of Pontius Pilate, and the hills of Golgotha. These are the places we remember when we meditate on our Lord's passion. When Jesus enters a place, he never leaves it as he found it. The most troubling places of our lives become the most amazing places of God's grace when Jesus visits them.

In this year's mid-week Lenten series, we will revisit the Places of the Passion. Our focus will not be on the physical locations of our Lord's passion, but on the spiritual wonders of his work: the places where he demonstrates his strength in the midst of our weakness, his timeless love in the midst of our temporal darkness.

Join us at 7:00 PM on Wednesday evenings, beginning March 13, for an encounter with Jesus. We will start with a light supper at 6:00 PM for nourishment and fellowship before our time together. Our Lenten Series this year will conclude on April 10 with the Crossroads Youth Group leading us through the Stations of the Cross.



# *A Note from Our Pastor*

Dear Friends in Christ,

I turned on the news channel the other day and you'll never guess what words flashed across the bottom of the picture, "Breaking News!" Actually you probably did guess it, because every day we see the same thing "Breaking News!" whether it's a new story or the continuation of a story we've heard about for weeks. And I realized how little impact that line really meant to me; in fact, I almost react with sarcasm when I hear that there is "Breaking News!" somewhere.

When you visit someone in the hospital there is a similar phenomenon that takes place. As you're in a room visiting a patient, invariably at some point an alarm will go off from one of the monitoring devices that the patient is attached to. The constant beeping, booping, wailing and chirping of these devices alerts the health care professionals that something needs to be attended to. The IV stand beeps when it's empty. The blood pressure alarm screams when the patient shifts in bed. The ventilator bongs when the patient coughs, and the heart rate monitor gives it's telltale flat-line whine when one of the stick-on pads comes lose. All these noises are almost enough to make a person sick.



Most of the alarms are of the "False" varieties, that don't require the nurse to come rushing in with the crash cart. They're just irritating, harmless occurrences that become a form of annoying noise after a while. One estimate measured that an alarm goes off every 66 seconds, which can cause something called "alarm fatigue" among health care professionals. It would be easy to assume that it's just another false alarm. But the consequence of ignoring alarms could be fatal, because you never know when one of these alarms truly is an emergency.

On Ash Wednesday we often hear from the prophet Joel who says, "Blow the trumpet in Zion! Sound the alarm on my holy mountain!" It's a warning for people to see whether or not their spiritual hearts are healthy and right with God in anticipation of his coming. In fact the whole season of Lent calls our attention to our spiritual health, and Joel encourages us to "Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love..."

The first step toward repentance and change or turning back to the Lord is confession. Confessing that everything isn't quite right and that we need God's will and God's way in our lives, is a step that we are all encouraged to take, especially in the midst of our stress filled, time constricted lifestyles. The season of Lent is a call to confession and repentance and a wonderful opportunity to come humbly before our God, who abounds in steadfast love for us.

I pray that you will take advantage of the special season of Lent that is now upon us, that you will take some time to take a spiritual inventory of your life, and that you will delve into the practices of prayer and meditation and confession to restore that life giving link between you and your creator, redeemer, and friend. And when you see some warning that demands your attention or hear an alarm go off, remember to heed the warning of Joel and return to the Lord your God.

## SELF - EXAMINATION

Lent is a time of self-examination where solid spiritual disciplines can become a permanent part of our lives. Rather than just giving up chocolate or adding a Bible reading for six-and-a-half weeks, Lent challenges us to drive deeply into ourselves and ask questions such as these:

- What progress am I making in sharing gladly what I have with others, particularly with the stranger and the poor?
- What attitudes do I convey to those who irritate me? How can awareness of my own need of God's grace enable me to be more gracious to them?
- How has my sense of interconnectedness in corporate worship grown of late, and how can I move ahead in appreciating the contributions and need of other members in the congregation to which I belong?
- Am I as charitable and thoughtful to family members as to others? Or do I "take it out" on my family when life at school or work gets hectic?
- Can I redistribute my long-range personal budget in order to have more money to give away?
- When I hear someone being unjustly maligned, do I speak up to correct the record, or am I a silent accomplice?
- How can I more effectively and consistently support legislation and social programs that help the disadvantaged rather than hurt them?
- In devotional acts of prayer and reading, am I increasing my attention span and discovering new ways of listening rather than of talking, of giving thanks rather than complaining?
- As I uncover and attempt to deal with one level of prejudice in my life, what other levels do I find lurking underneath, and how can I confront them?
- In addition to intercessory prayer, what habits can I develop that allow me to be more responsive to the sick, the distressed, and the bereaved, particularly when the needs emerge suddenly and require immediate attention? Can I plan spaces into my life to allow for such unanticipated opportunities to minister to others?
- Am I, by consistent attendance in worship, a witness to others of the worthiness of the God I follow? Or am I, by more sporadic attendance, suggesting that God is worth serving some times, but not others?

## **Roof/Siding Project**

### **Sanctuary Enhancements Task Force**

At our annual meeting in January, we were introduced to two important developments that will impact the future of our congregation. The first is an essential repair to the western portion of the building (the “new” addition, which is not new anymore). A complicated **roof/siding project** is necessary to repair the damaging leaking issues that have plagued the building for years. We have contracted with D-Wing Construction to undertake this project later in the spring. In hopes that we do not need to dig too deeply into our building fund, we are seeking donations to help cover the estimated \$65,000 cost.

The building fund has helped Holy Spirit reduce our mortgage debt considerably over the last decade. Some generous angel donors would allow us to keep that fund working to save thousands of dollars toward the mortgage. Watch for a letter coming for your opportunity to help.

The second item is an opportunity to **enhance our worship space**. Our sanctuary tile floor is in need of repair or replacement. Before we undertake this project, we would like to consider other projects that may contribute to our Sunday morning worship. A special task force is forming now to begin the process of assessing our congregation’s wishes for the future of the sanctuary. We will only proceed after many people have given their input. What do you envision for our sanctuary? Would you like to play a role in updating it? Please let Pastor Tim or Joe Labellarte (Council liaison for Long-term Planning) know.

## **Sanctuary Improvement Meeting**

On Sunday, March 3rd at 12:00 after our 10:45 worship service, we will be meeting to discuss plans to make improvements to the sanctuary. The tile floor itself is the primary concern, but as we prepare to upgrade the floor, we will also be considering seating, best use of our space, the sound system, and more. ## Transitional Housing is a Reality!

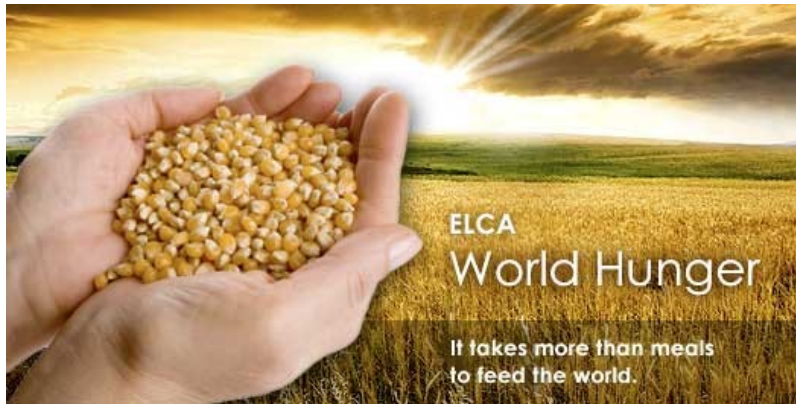
Last year some of the money raised by WELCA went to an organization in Mexico to help build transitional housing. Now we can see the actual product of your donations!

# church council MEETING

## Highlights from February 2019

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on February 11th. New Church Council members Jennifer Prosk (Children's Education) and Bill Collins (Stewardship) were welcomed. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$27,590. Operating expenses were \$22,218.

**The Pastor's report:** The Listening Campaign continues and is proceeding well. Additional participation is requested and encouraged. Please sign up in the narthex.

**Committees** of the council provided reports of various activities. **Worship & Music** were pleased with the Youth Sunday service, which seemed well-received. February 24 will be a one-service Sunday at 9:30 am for Jazz Sunday. Lenten suppers and Wednesday services will be underway soon; in an effort to improve participation, Church Council will host a supper, and other church groups will be asked to provide suppers. If you are interested in hosting a Lenten supper, please contact Carol Duprey. **Christian Education** reports that Sensational Sunday was held on February 3 and was well-attended. Tuesday LYFE is wrapping up "Baking through the Bible." Miss Jennifer continues working hard to post news and activities to our Facebook Page, "LCHS Children's Ministry"--please like it! Mardi Gras will be held on March 5. **Growth** continues follow up with visitors and potential new members and will send postcards to the community about Easter Services. **CUFF** had hosted Wine Tasting on February 8<sup>th</sup>-thanks to Amy Steinberger for helping with another great event. Corned Beef and Cabbage is coming up on March 15. **Long Range Planning** continues with preliminary sanctuary enhancement exploration. **Youth** did a great job with the Youth Sunday service on February 3 and raised \$708.70 for the Northern Illinois Food Bank. Youth will be conducting a youth-oriented "Listening Campaign," with an online survey and opportunities to meet one-on-one. **Finance** reported that the line of credit has been approved. **Property** addressed issues arising from winter weather. A church wide message will be sent inviting members to contribute to a fund for the roof repair project. **Human Needs** is still in need of volunteers for PADS. The Blood Drive is scheduled for March 24. Thanks to Pam Labellarte for spearheading a COOL Pantry bag drive, gathering food donations in response to shortages after the federal shutdown.

**Old Business:** On Monday, February 25, a Lincolnshire police officer will come to the property to develop a safety plan. An ALICE Training workshop, open to all members, is being planned. **New Business:** Appointments will be made to the Columbarium, Endowment, and Financial Review Committees in March. Several members have offered to participate Sanctuary Enhancements Task Force, and meetings will be announced. LCHS can send 3 delegates to the Synod Convention on June 7-8, 2019; interested persons are welcome to see Pastor Tim about participation. The WELCA Boutique is scheduled for November 2, 2019, and Trudy Bettiker will contact vendors; a bake sale coordinator is needed.

**Next council meeting is March 11th at 7:30 PM.** All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.

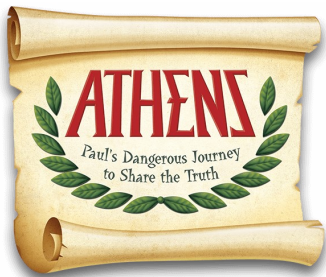


## Homeless Shelter Season is NOW!
