


The famous theologian and writer, Eugene Peterson once wrote an article about gratitude, he wrote, "Is wonder-induced gratitude the most fundamental of human responses, the emotion most congruent with life? Johnny Bergman was a young man in my congregation. He and his wife were enthusiastic participants, but then the weeds of worldly care choked their young faith. They acquired children; they became suddenly wealthy and their lives filled up with boats and cars, house-building and social engagements. They were in worship less and less frequently and then not at all. After a two-year absence, on a bright winter Epiphany Sunday, Johnny was there again. Surprised to see him, I said, "Johnny! What brought you to worship today?" He said, "I woke this morning feeling so good, so blessed, so alive -- so created -- I just had to say thank you, and this is the only place I could think of to say it adequately. I wanted to say it to Jesus."

It is with this joyful and passionate sense of gratitude that we begin a new year, a year brimming with hope and promise. My prayer for each of you is that you let God dwell richly in your hearts, that you live with confidence that all things are possible with the God who strengthens us, and that you let the light of God's love shine brightly through you to a world that so desperately needs it. The Life We Bury by Allen Eskens

College student Joe Talbert has the modest goal of completing a writing assignment for an English class. His task is to interview a stranger and write a brief biography of the person. With deadlines looming, Joe heads to a nearby nursing home to find a willing subject. There he meets Carl Iverson, and soon nothing in Joe's life is ever the same. Carl is a dying Vietnam veteran—and a convicted murderer. With only a few months to live, he has been medically paroled to a nursing home after spending thirty years in prison for the crimes of rape and murder.

As Joe writes about Carl's life, especially Carl's valor in Vietnam, he cannot reconcile the heroism of the soldier with the despicable acts of the convict. Aided by his skeptical neighbor, Lila, Joe throws himself into uncovering the truth. Thread by thread, he begins to unravel the tapestry of Carl's conviction. But as he and Lila dig deeper into the circumstances of the crime, the stakes grow higher. Will Joe discover the truth before it's too late to escape the fallout?

Highlights from November 2019

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on December 9th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$40,237 for November (YTD total is \$441,237). Operating expenses were \$27,461 in November (YTD total is \$488,454).

The Pastor's report: We have had some major events in the past month heading into the holiday season. A Fellowship Planning Potluck will be held on January 12. The annual budget review meeting will be held at 9:00 am on January 12. Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Stewardship reported that the celebration meal on November 17 was a great success. The stewardship appeal is underway; total amount pledged is \$308,940, with 62 responses. Cards are being developed so that those who give electronically can place a card in the offering basket for presentation at the altar. Offering envelopes for next year are available for pick up. Youth reported on participation in Hanging of the Greens and the Christmas program. Youth Sunday February 2 is the next big event. Worship & Music is preparing for Christmas holiday services with heavy hearts. Temporary accompanists are arranged in the short term. December 29, January 5, 12, and 19 are one-service Sundays, at 9:30. Christian Education reported that they have been very busy with Advent wreath-making/Hanging of the Green, the Christmas program, and the Christmas tree display. Tuesday LYFE went to Bernie's Book Bank and loved it. CUFF reported that upcoming events are Fellowship Potluck on January 12 and Wine Tasting in February. Finance reported that the Finance Review committee met and discussed the Preliminary Budget, reviewed Church Accounts, the Endowment Fund and Columbarium; no issues were found. Larry Brady made a motion to approve the slate of Wayne Giampietro, Arnie Bilstad, and Julie Utterback for the Financial Review committee. Daaron Dohler seconded the motion; the motion passed. The property insurer recently raised an issue about premium calculation; our insurance agent will follow up, and will verify calculation and proper premium amount. Growth reported that the committee mailed close to 500 postcards inviting visitors and new community members to our Christmas services. The families of several of our new Tuesday LYFE and Confirmation students have been attending, and some have made commitments to giving to Holy Spirit. Human Needs reported that plans continue for the Christmas outreach program. Long-Range Planning reported that the committee met and discussed a number of issues and the church's mission. The primary goal is to create a short-term team of diverse ages and backgrounds to focus on church development, outreach, and mission. **Personnel** reported that planning for Christmas gifts for staff is underway. **Property** reported that a variety of tasks have been completed and are underway, including gutter cleaning and gasket replacement. The property committee is looking ahead to tasks for springtime. Old Business: Nominating Committee continues work on a slate. The Sanctuary Enhancement Task Force met and reported on flooring options and costs, as well as seating configurations and the sound system. The 2020 budget proposal was reviewed and will be finalized. The Annual Meeting will be held on January 19.

Next council meeting is January 13th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex. Annual reports are due in early January.


Snow Removal
