## A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

Followers of Jesus are inspired to develop practices and patterns for daily living that characterize a life that is devoted to daily discipleship. The ELCA has promoted a model of seven faith practices to model and nurture. These are:

Pray Frequently Study Scripture Diligently

Worship Regularly Invite Others Often

Pass on the Faith Serve for the Sake of Others

Give Freely

As we prepare for another Vacation Bible School later this month, which for most congregations is the greatest outreach effort they make throughout the entire year, the faith practice of Passing on the Faith has caught my attention. At a conference I attended last fall, the presenter talked about how if a child is not introduced to a life of faith by the time they are 18, whether that be Christian, Jewish, Muslim, or any other, the likelihood of that individual ever becoming involved in a life of faith in God is like 1 or 2 out of 100. Now that doesn't mean that an un-churched individual can't be a good person who contributes to bettering our society, but imagine what our world would be like if only 1 or 2 out of 100 had experienced the transformational power of a life in Christ.

A three-and-a half-year study of Christian Education in six denominations concluded that "The primary aim of congregational life is to nurture...a vibrant, life-changing faith, the kind of faith that shapes one's way of being, thinking, and acting." The primary goals then, of the teaching ministries of our congregation, are to result in the transformation of people's lives and to help people grow in faith.

There is probably no better way to fulfill such goals, than for us to reach out to our community through Vacation Bible School. Because VBS is not just another program, it is an opportunity to build relationships with people who may be lacking in faith, it's an opportunity to give freely of our time and talents, it's an opportunity to serve for the sake of others and for the sake of the church. And above all it's an opportunity to plant the seeds of faith in the next generation of believers, and church leaders.

I would encourage us all to make this mission a part of our personal mission in life, to help us live in God's will and for God's purposes. Just as we plant the seeds of the gospel in the hearts of our children during Vacation Bible School, let's sow the seed of mission in our hearts, so that the fruit of the Spirit will continue to grow and flourish. Let's be about transforming people's lives and helping each other grow in faith.

#### **Election of a New Bishop**

#### Synod Assembly, June 7 & 8, 2019 by Janice Edwards

This year's synod assembly had all of the usual activities - workshops, resolutions, budget approval, worship,

mission moments – but the most notable event was election of a new bishop, Yehiel Curry. The election itself followed a process that was very organized and democratic, but which managed to be a bit wild and wooly at the same time. Two months before the election, synod assembly attendees were asked to identify potential nominees for bishop. The top six potential nominees (potential, because nominations are made only at the synod assembly, and the first ballot is an ecclesiastical one, at which any ordained person may be nominated), participated in four forums of two hours each, held in various locations all over the synod. Win or lose, these persons provided powerful testimony in these forums to their faith in God and the church, setting out their visions for a hopeful new direction.



As expected, the ecclesiastical ballot was a free-for-all, with 61 persons nominated for bishop, many with only one or two votes. Our Pastor Tim was in the top 10, with five votes! Nominees with ten or more votes (the previously identified nominees, plus one) advanced to the next round. After five ballots, further presentations and questioning, a bit of politicking, and some reshuffling we had a new bishop. We trust that the Holy Spirit was at work in our deliberations, and that our choice of Yehiel Curry was a good one. His six-year term begins on September 1, with installation in October.

## Highlights from June 2019

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on June 10th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$28,494; YTD total is \$230,631 (including roof repair donations). Operating expenses were \$31,698 (YTD total is \$183,505)(not including roof repair).

The Pastor's report: Camp Lincolnshire is using the building for summer camp. Draft 2019-2020 church calendars were circulated for advance planning and discussion at the next council meeting. Jennifer Williams will be hired in the near term to fill the Youth Director. Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Growth reported that a number of families recently have expressed interest in our church, and notes have been sent to thank them for worshipping with us. Pam Labellarte is chairing our participation the Deerfield Farmers' Market on July 20. We will be participating in the Lincolnshire July 4 Parade, where we will be handing out LCHS-labeled water bottles and wearing LCHS t-shirts. PLEASE JOIN IN THE PARADE! A group also walked in the Buffalo Grove Pride Parade on June 2. Human Needs reported that the next blood drive is being planned for October. The RefugeeOne benefit concert will be held on October 20 at 3:00 pm. Options are being explored for additional service activities in October. Long Range-Planning continues with sanctuary enhancement planning and has circulated a survey. Please take a few moments to complete the survey. Personnel: Annual background checks will be performed on staff as required by our insurer. **Property** reported that the roofing repair project proceeded successfully and as planned. Annual parking lot blacktopping will be planned for August. Youth committee will communicate and work with Jennifer Williams for upcoming plans and activities. Teens are encouraged to participate in the July 4 parade. Worship & Music reported that special music services were held and well-received on Music Sunday and Pentecost. We are on summer worship schedule, with one Sunday service at 9:30 through Rally Day (September 8) and Monday evening services at 7:00 pm, which began on June 3. Summer choir will continue singing twice per month during the summer, with rehearsals shortly before service begins. Please join us in song. Christian Education reported the team met to discuss and plan, including LYFE service projects, Trunk or Treating, and Rally Day. VBS preparations are underway. VBS information and registration are available in the narthex and online, including a VBS Facebook promotions to better publicize ourselves on social media. Finance presented mortgage prepayment and reamortization options, and a motion was made and approved to prepay \$25,000 on the mortgage and reamortize in January, 2020 when the interest rate reset goes into effect. C.U.F.F. The church picnic was held at Tennaqua Swim and Racquet Club on June 23 and was great fun.

**Old Business:** The Sanctuary Enhancements Task Force continues its work. Please complete the survey. Lutheran Day Nursery visited on Thursday, June 27. Thanks to all who helped.

**New Business**: Report from Synod Assembly: The main item on the agenda was the election of a new Synod Bishop. Yehiel Curry was elected.

Next council meeting is August 12th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.


