A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

During the month of February and up until the season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, we will journey through the season of Epiphany, which is a special time in the life of the Church. The dictionary defines "epiphany" as "a revealing, a manifestation, an unveiling." Our church sees the Epiphany season as the time when Christ's lordship over all creation is revealed, manifested, unveiled. What was once made known only to the Holy Family and the shepherds at Christmas became known to a much larger and greater audience. First, Jesus is revealed as Son of God to the Magi, who came from distant lands to worship and give tribute to this infant King. Jesus is revealed as Son of God to John the Baptist and his disciples at the river Jordan and to the great crowds that came to declare their repentance. Jesus is revealed as Son of God around the Sea of Galilee, particularly to group that would become his followers, some fishermen, and even a tax collector. The season of Epiphany concludes with the Transfiguration of our Lord, when Jesus went to the mountaintop with his disciples and shone like the sun, as God again revealed to Jesus' disciples that this is God's Son, the chosen one, and that we must listen to him.

Jesus' epiphany as "Son of God" reaches across time as we gather together as the Church each Sunday, to hear God's word proclaimed and to feast at the Lord's Table. And as Jesus is revealed to us once again in the breaking of the bread we embrace His call to "Come and see, come and follow, go and tell others." Because Christ is here, and present among us, we, who have come and followed, must reveal him to others so that they too may know him as the Son of God. We must broaden our vision of Christ's work here on earth, and more specifically here in Lincolnshire and the surrounding community, so that all may come to know that Jesus is the light of the world.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the

light of life." (John 8:12) One of my favorite images of Jesus is the "Light of the World," and John writes, "If we live in that light as disciples, following Jesus as Lord, we become children of light. Put your trust in the light while you have it, so that you may become sons and daughters of light" (John 12:36). "I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth" (Acts 13:47).



In this season that considers how Christ is revealed to us and how he is manifested in our lives, let us attempt to fill that call to be a light for all who live in darkness, and live a life full of love and grace. As we invite our friends to join us in worship and in fellowship, let us embrace the fact that Jesus' light not only shines on us, but his love and his light shines through us for all to see, and for all to see the way to Him.

When we focus our lives on Jesus, we can break through all the challenges and disappointments that often come with these cold and dreary days, and we can bring the light of Christ to all who so desperately need it.

So shine on! Shine on, all you faithful believers, shine on all you children of light, shine on!

Shine like the Son!



It has been my privilege to serve as your Congregation Council president for the past two years. I owe a huge thank you to Pastor Tim, Laurie, and your Council members. The saying goes that if you want something done, ask the busiest person you know. That is certainly true of Council --they are all extremely busy people, yet they give of their time to help Holy Spirit run smoothly.

If you missed the annual meeting, you may not be aware of some possible changes that will be discussed in the coming year. Pastor Tim asked for feedback about potential attendance for different service times - possibly adding a weekly Saturday evening service and changing our 11PM Christmas Eve service to an earlier time. We continue to pursue alternatives for sanctuary enhancements, especially repaired flooring and flexible seating for a portion of the sanctuary. None of these decisions have been made. Please let Pastor Tim or Joe Labellarte know if you'd like to participate in one of the committees considering options. We will continue to listen to the needs and wants of our members and look forward to the future. As always, the Council will be careful stewards of your contributions to Holy Spirit.

We have a great deal of talent and resources in our congregation. Please consider how your gifts can help Holy Spirit share Christ's message within our membership and to the community in the coming year...and beyond. We need to make decisions that will ensure Holy Spirit's vitality for the next several decades.

I have confidence that you will support the newlyelected Council with your prayers and your treasures. The ELCA says "God's work; our hands." Let's put those hands to work!



Highlights from January 2020

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on January 13th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$64,184 for December (YTD total is \$505,632). Operating expenses were \$54,076 in December (YTD total is \$542,530).

The Pastor's report: The annual budget review meeting and a Fellowship Planning Potluck were held on January 12. Pastor met with members of the Indian language group that meets in the building about community-building and outreach activities. Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Youth reported on Youth Service Sunday and Souper Bowl of Caring scheduled for February 2 with a planning meeting with breakfast on January 26 between services. Worship & Music reported that Taize and early Christmas Eve services were well attended; consideration is being given to changing the third service time on Christmas Eve in an effort to increase attendance. Temporary accompanists are arranged in the short term and permanent arrangements are being pursued. Sunday worship at 8:30 and 10:45 am returns on January 26, except there will be one service at 9:30 am on February 23 for Jazz Service and Mardi Gras. Christian Education is running smoothly after holiday festivities and Sunday School returns to its usual schedule on January 26. Tuesday LYFE resumed after the holiday break. CUFF reported that the Fellowship Planning Potluck was well attended with many ideas presented for new events in the upcoming year, including a trivia night with informal BYOB wine in February, and corned beef and cabbage in March. Finance continued discussion of the proposed 2020 Budget. Human Needs reported that a blood drive will be held in March and that community outreach activities are being planned, including a 5k event in the Fall. Long-Range Planning reported that the committee is putting a task force together to discuss issues and the church's mission and strategy. **Personnel** reported that Christmas gifts for staff were given and gratefully acknowledged. Property reported that maintenance tasks and snow plowing as needed are ongoing. Stewardship reported that an offering card is being prepared for members who contribute electronically to place in offering baskets. Offering envelopes for 2020 are available for pick up. Old Business: Nominating Committee continued its work on a slate. The Sanctuary Enhancement Task Force continued its work in assessing flooring options and costs, as well as seating configurations and the sound system. The 2020 budget was reviewed and finalized for the Annual Meeting on January 19. New Business: Council is considering options for a Brigid Cantagallo memorial, in consultation with the family. A motion was made for congregational approval of the January 20, 2019 Annual Meeting minutes at the upcoming Annual Meeting.


Snow Removal
