

A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I celebrated Thanksgiving this past week with my side of the family and Maria's side of the family, I was captured by the many stories that were told of memorable events and memorable people. And as these stories are told they not only recall legendary events and people, but they also bring us into and make us part of the story.

The prophet Micah (5:2-5) told a story as well, he told of the promise of a Savior.

The birth of a Savior would take place in Bethlehem, an unknown and unimportant town. Out of this city, One would be born who would "come for me," that is, come to carry out the Father's saving will. He would rule over Israel as her spiritual king. The new ruler, Jesus, would establish a new kingdom, one that would never fall. This promised king would have no beginning, because his "origins are from old," in the timelessness of eternity. "He will shepherd his flock...and they will live securely, for then his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth. And He will be their peace."

What the prophet Micah said would happen, happened, and his words still capture us today.

There's another story of a little girl who had a father who was always traveling and away from home. He decided, because he wasn't there to read bedtime stories to her every night, he would simply record them on a tape recorder, so she could play one whenever she wanted. One evening, as he was across the country on business, he called his wife and asked to talk to his daughter. "How are you doing?" he asked. "Fine," she said, "but I wish you were here to read me a story." "Remember,' he said, "you have tape recordings I made...listen to one of them." She paused for a moment and then she said, "No, Daddy, I want a story told by someone with skin and teeth."

The Christmas story and all the many stories of faith are best told face-to-face by people with "skin and teeth." And what better time to share these stories and invite all our loved ones into these stories, but at this special time of year. The intimacy we have with our friends and families are the ideal setting for us to share our faith.

For nothing was more intimate than that God came down from heaven to dwell in our midst, to be one with us. To live under the law, and do what we cannot do, fulfill the law perfectly for us. He would not do it via the internet, or by texting, or by simply speaking from heavenly angels. He would come in the flesh and communicate God's love, face-to face. He would not come to live but to die. God would make "Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." (2 Cor. 5:21)

I pray that during this wonderful Christmas season that we might all share the story of Christ. May His light guide your way and shatter all your darkness. Have a blessed Christmas!

Highlights from November 2018

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on November 12th. Treasurer's report included year-to-date operating fund income of \$362,703. This includes 10/12th of \$66,000 of prepays for 2018. Our year-to-date fund expenses are \$376,448.

The Pastor's report: Pastor Tim attended a Boundary Workshop with the Metro Chicago Synod. He's been busy with various activities throughout the church. Items have been going missing in the church so we are having to lock more doors than usual. We would like members to come in the front door and check in if they're going to be working in the building during the week.

Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Worship & Music had a great turnout for the concert to benefit Refugee One. Please note we will have one service at 9:30a.m on November 25th, December 23rd, December 30th and January 6th. Christian Education had a good turnout for Trunk or Treat. Our next event will be during the Hanging of the Greens on Saturday, December 1st. More information to come. Long Range Planning will address the broken tiles in the sanctuary and carpet issues on the altar. Youth will be planning service and fun activities for the upcoming months. Stewardship has ended. Please return your commitment cards and Lego pieces. Property has received multiple estimates for the roof. Council has recommended using D-Wing Construction to complete the project. More information will be given at the Annual Congregational Meeting. Human Needs is in need of overnight volunteers for PADS. Please sign up on the Sign Up Genius link.

Old Business: The Nominating Committee is looking for volunteers to fill three spots. They will work with the Lincolnshire Police Department to come up with a plan then share with the congregation. 
