A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we prepare to celebrate Jesus' triumphal resurrection with the entire church across the world, it may feel more like we're wandering through the desert, hoping that some day we'll find the promised land. I find myself already complaining about little things and I hear myself in the words of those who regularly lifted up their complaints to Moses as he was leading them from slavery to a new start and in a new land of their own.

In many ways, the whole of scripture is about people who go through struggles. It's about challenges and painful experiences. And the message is to remain strong through prayer and through relying on Christ, and when we do we feel our burdens lifted and we develop strength to carry on.

John Maxwell once wrote an article for *Christianity Today* that can provide us some hope and inspiration for this journey. He wrote:

I heard a silversmith talk about refining silver. He said, "I must sit with my eyes steadily fixed on the furnace; for if the time necessary for refining be exceeded in the slightest degree, the silver will be injured. I never take my eye off the silver in the furnace. If I take it out too early, it won't be purified. If I leave it in too late, it will be injured. When the silver is in the fire, I focus. I don't let anything distract me. I watch the silver, carefully waiting for the right moment to take it out.

"When is the right moment?" I asked. He said, "I know the silver is pure when I can see my face reflected there."

When I'm in a storm, as soon as the storm comes, I'm saying, "Okay, God bail me out! Find me. Rescue me!" Sometimes he doesn't rescue me. He doesn't come. But He is the great silversmith. While I'm in the furnace, he focuses and watches. His job isn't a quick rescue mission. His job is to purify. He holds me until the right moment, and then he comes – never too early – never too late – right on time.

If we choose to, we can look at this great ordeal involving the coronavirus as a time when God is carefully and intensively working to purify us, so that God's face might be reflected in all we are and in all we do. It's an intriguing way to reframe all the challenges and inconveniences and struggles we'll be going through, to believe that even in the heat of the moment, we are being gradually perfected into something much greater than we have ever been.

When we consider all that our Lord and Savior Jesus went through that led to his trial, persecution, and death on a cross, we know that he paid the price, he completed his journey, and he overcame the sins of the world, to rise triumphant on the third day! Jesus Christ is Risen! And we are a resurrection church that will rise to meet the challenges before us as we are refined and restored to new life!

We know the end of the story. And just as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection, we will celebrate when this whole pandemic challenge is over, as we are restored to new life, refined and perfected to be the people of God.

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!



LCHS Response to Covid-19

Through teleconferencing platforms like ZOOM, we will continue to meet with each other. The church council, prayer group and our capital campaign team have already utilized this technology so that we can continue to work together and be the church we are called to be.

Our relationship with God centers on our ongoing communication with God through prayer. As we learn of the many needs of people who need our prayer and lift them up in prayer, we also receive comfort, peace, hope, and inspiration as we experience the abundance that comes from God, and grow in our relationship with God through prayer.

Highlights from March 2020

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on March 9th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$32,369 for February (YTD total is \$57,958). Operating expenses were \$36,121 in February (YTD total is \$70,821).

The Pastor's report: Many events and activities have occurred and are scheduled. Sunday worship attendance and building use requests were discussed. The April Church Council meeting will be held on April 20, not April 13. Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Worship & Music reported that Lenten suppers are underway, and volunteers still are needed for the April 1 meal. February 23 was Jazz Service successful and well-attended. The brass and Choir are rehearsing for Easter. Cherubs will sing Palm Sunday. Organists are scheduled through May. Worship assistants are being scheduled. Christian Education reported that Mardi Gras was a great success. VBS will be a "Wilderness Escape," July 27-31; many volunteers are needed, with more information to follow. Good Friday children's service is Friday April 10 at 11 am. LYFE dinner and celebration will be May 5 at 6 pm. CUFF reported that Trivia Night was well received, with corned beef and cabbage set for March 13. Growth reported that the committee is working with Ellie Kasche & Bill Vaananen to create a Facebook/Instagram campaign for Easter at Holy Spirit. The Easter banner is scheduled to be displayed during the 2 weeks preceding Easter. Pam Labellarte will chair the Holy Spirit booth at the July Deerfield Farmers' Market. Human Needs reported that Vitalant cancelled the March blood drive. Pam Labellarte spearheaded a successful food drive for COOL Pantry. LCHS is staffing and supplying PADS on April 11. Long-Range Planning reported that the committee continues its work and preliminary meetings will be held during Adult Forum time to provide updates and invite participation. **Property** reported that maintenance tasks and upkeep are ongoing. The next work day is April 4. Stewardship reported that Offering cards were introduced March 1, and many comments were received and are being considered. On March 1, Barry Nelson presented a very good tutorial concerning the benefits of a donor advisory fund and electronic giving. Cost-saving adjustments to future offering envelope box orders are under consideration. Youth reported that many youth participated in Mardi Gras and were very helpful, especially with floats. A "March Madness" bracket contest is underway, with a minimum \$5 contribution, to start fundraising for the next ELCA Gathering. The next Youth event will be Stations of the Cross on April 1; youth assistance is needed, please contact Jennifer Williams. Youth also are encouraged to assist with Good Friday service. The Sanctuary Enhancement Task Force continued its work. Delegates for Synod Convention June 5-6 are needed; see Pastor Tim if interested. The Capital Campaign Creative Team met on March 8. The theme of this campaign will be "Building a Foundation." A logo design was submitted and is being developed with the theme. More information and opportunities to participate will be forthcoming. **New Business:** Council discussed preparations for and response to COVID-19. Preparations are underway in this developing situation and are being communicated via email, and at services and other events. Members are urged to personally monitor and follow CDC recommendations during this rapidly changing situation. WELCA is considering options for increasing oven capacity in the kitchen. Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit Continuing Resolutions and Policy on Sexual Harassment and Misconduct were reaffirmed. Scott Schwanke was appointed to the Columbarium Committee. Jackie Murphy and Werner Brisske were appointed to the Endowment Committee.

Next council meeting currently is scheduled for April 20th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.
