A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy New Year!!! I pray that we will all have a blessed and prosperous New Year, and I look forward to the blessings and opportunities that will allow our church to grow and prosper in the coming year as well!

It was wonderful to see the church so full on Christmas Eve, with the joyous music, and the candles lighting up the sanctuary, shining through the night like the light of the world, as we sung our praises to God. Christmas is such a special, sacred time for all believers and to bring so many together reminds us of God's plan for the world. As Jesus was being born in Bethlehem, people from very diverse backgrounds were drawn together to worship Him. Highlights from December 2018

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on December 10th. Treasurer's report included year-to-date operating fund income of \$335,914. This includes 11/12th of \$66,000 of prepays for 2018. Our year-to-date fund expenses are \$420,266.

The Pastor's report: Pastor Tim participated in an Interfaith Thanksgiving service as well as our own Thanksgiving service. He's also been busy meeting with various committees to wrap up the year and plan for the next year. The rest of this month will be busy with all the holiday events.

Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Worship & Music is busy preparing for Christmas services. Reminder there will only be one service at 9:30 on December 23rd and 30th and January 6th. Christian Education had a small turnout for the family gathering during Hanging of the Greens. The children put on another fabulous Christmas Program. Long Range Planning is getting estimates for the sanctuary floor. More information to come. Youth are preparing for Youth Sunday on February 3rd. They are also planning another blind volleyball tournament. Finance Committee met and is finalizing the annual report. Stewardship appeal has ended. Commitments are ahead of last year but we still have quite a ways to go to reach our goal. Property replaced the range in the kitchen. They are awaiting the final proposal from D-Wing for the roof replacement. After preseason maintenance was performed, it was determined 3 furnace units may have to be replaced before the end of the winter. Human Needs is still in need of overnight volunteers for PADS. Several area churches were contacted about helping. Holy Cross is considering helping. Growth sent out over 500 postcards to new people in the community.

Old Business: The Nominating Committee has filled all the slots for the outgoing Council members. Revisions were made to the 2019 budget. **New Business**: Annual Congregation Meeting will take place on January 27th.

Next council meeting is January 14th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.


