A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

Christmas is a time of gifts and there is no greater gift than the gift of the Christ child that comes to us once again this time of year. Jesus came to us as an infant child so that the whole world would be saved. It's an incredible thing to consider, that God would become like us, and that God would accept death so that we might accept life, but that's part of the wondrous mystery of Christmas. Sometimes gifts come in very strange and unusual packages.

As we enter into the season of Epiphany, we also remember some other famous gift givers, the "Three Kings" or Magi who came bearing gifts for a newborn king. These are more than just gifts for they symbolize as much about the receiver of these gifts as they do of the givers.

Gold was the privilege of the kings, who owned all the gold could get their hands on. The incense, Frankincense, was used in many ancient cultures in religious rites to indicate the presence of the deity. And Myrrh was used as a painkiller, an embalming substance, a fragrance, and a beauty treatment. Thus by the gifts they bring, the Magi identify Jesus as the supreme ruler of the world, as God's anointed high priest, and as the suffering servant who dies as a fragrant and beautiful offering before God. And like the Magi, the gifts we give can also say a great deal about us and the one we praise.



As we enter into a new year, perhaps it's a good time to take inventory of our gifts and how we plan to use them in the coming year. God has given us the gift of faith, the gift of forgiveness from our sins, and the promise that he will never leave us. Highlights from December 2020

The monthly Church Council meeting was held via Zoom on December 14th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$29,381 for November (YTD total is \$373,411 (including PPP loan amount)). Operating expenses were \$33,783 in November (YTD total is \$401,136).

Consistent with State guidelines and recommendations, formal office hours The Pastor's report: temporarily have been suspended, and the office is open by appointment only. District 103 will be using building space one day per week. Other building use remains on hold due to the pandemic and in-person school closures. The church's longtime custodial service is ceasing operations due to medical reasons and a replacement service is under consideration. **Christian Education** reported that Tuesday LYFE continues with appropriate precautions, based upon participating family input. Sunday school has moved online. The virtual Christmas program was a great success and very well done. Advent wreath kits were distributed to families upon request. CUFF reported that virtual game events are being planned. Finance reported that The Finance Review Committee is working on annual review processes and audits. Growth reported that church social media accounts have been updated with events and activities. Human Needs reported that PADs collected food donations in December and Angel Tree donations were delivered. Long-Range **Planning** reported that Technology needs are being assessed for live streaming worship services and for staff. Personnel reported that evaluation processes are underway. Property reported that Joel is monitoring property conditions and conducting upkeep tasks. Monitored security service proposals were considered and determined to be cost-prohibitive. Joel continues to reach out about building use. Stewardship reported that the annual Stewardship appeal is underway; pledges and time and talent forms continue to be received. Worship and Music reported that online services are being well received and widely viewed. Weather permitting, an outdoor, informal Christmas Eve service without communion will be held, by reservation; it also will be live streamed. A recorded traditional Christmas Eve service also will be made available. Communion cups are available and can be picked up by appointment from the church office. Old Business: The Task Force continues to meet and plan, monitoring conditions, guidelines, guidance, and congregation considerations. The Council continues to receive updates and unanimously approves of the work of the Task Force. The Nominating Committee has compiled a slate of candidates. Preparations for the virtual format Annual Meeting are underway.

Next council meeting currently is scheduled for January 11th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.


Prayer Concerns
