A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

uring the last couple weeks I couldn't help but notice how the leaves in the trees have begun to start changing color. And the beautiful warm days that we've had recently, have also begun to have some cool ones scattered among them. Now I love the changing seasons, especially the change from summer to fall with its beautiful fall colors and the warm days and cooler evenings. But this year, for some reason, as I observe the changing colors of the trees my reaction has been, "Oh no! Slow down! The trees are turning too soon! It's not even October! We have to make this season last!" And so rather than enjoying and celebrating this beautiful time of year, I've found myself grieving the loss of something that was never mine to begin with.

I'm sure the influence of this season of COVID-19 has something to do with my reaction. With the colder weather we will spend more time indoors, and as we practice all those behaviors to prevent the spread of this deadly virus, we will be even more isolated once again. So perhaps there is a sense of impending loss as we change seasons. In this time of so many contrasts, I am reminded of the words of the great teacher in the book of Ecclesiastes.

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. A time to be born and a time to die. A time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted. A time to kill, and a time to heal. A time to break down, and a time to build up. A time to weep, and a time to laugh. A time to mourn, and a time to dance. A time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together. A time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing. A time to seek, and a time to lose. A time to keep, and a time to throw away. A time to tear, and a time to sew. A time to keep silence, and a time to speak. A time to love, and a time to hate. A time for war, and a time for peace. (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8)

The scope of these verses show that we live in a world of change, and although some of the changes are driven by the acts of people, much of the change is determined by a supreme power. The teacher explains, "We must make the best of that which is, and must believe it best for the present, and accommodate ourselves to it. For God has made everything beautiful for its time."

That which seems most unpleasant to us, is yet, in its proper time altogether fitting. Cold is as fitting in winter as heat is in summer, the night has beauty in its darkness, just as the day is gloriously bright. There is a wonderful harmony in the divine Providence of God, and when we come to consider the interrelatedness of everything, together with the seasons, all will appear very beautiful, to the glory of God and the comfort of those who trust in Him. Though we do not see the complete beauty of God's Providence, one day we shall see it, and a glorious sight it will be, when the mystery of God shall be finished. Then everything shall appear to have been done in the most proper time and it will be the wonder of eternity.

So in the meantime, we wait with patience and trust in the protective care and guidance of God, believing that God has made all things beautiful, even when we have a hard time seeing it.

Managing God's Gifts To Us

Stewardship Sunday Is Coming

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's stewardship committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

As we come to worship on Stewardship Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by Stewardship Sunday. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our pastor or leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Stewardship Sunday through the Stewardship team and governing council members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to participate in Stewardship Sunday.

Highlights from September 2020

The monthly Church Council meeting was held via Zoom on September 13th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$25,118 for August (YTD total is \$287,940 (including PPP loan amount)). Operating expenses were \$34,982 in August (YTD total is \$288,187).

The Pastor's report: The Nursery School has begun operating on a modified basis. Other paying building users have not yet provided use projections despite ongoing outreach to them. Confirmation will not occur in the Fall; instruction is expected to begin for current 7th and 8th graders on a modified basis. Outside services will continue, with links to recorded services being provided. The Task Force continues planning and monitoring of conditions, government guidelines, and Synod input. Consideration is being given to a mid-week interactive devotional gathering if in-person services are not possible later in the season. LCNS **Presentation.** Allison Wyrwicz, congregation member and LCNS Treasurer apprised the Council of the nursery school's plans and circumstances. LCNS has made cost and staff reductions, and has received a PPP loan, but due to pandemic conditions and significantly lower enrollment, LCNS is operating at a deficit. LCNS has proposed paying full rent for September and October and is seeking rent forgiveness for November and December, deferring consideration of rent payments for the remainder of the school year. Stewardship reported that plans are underway for the annual Stewardship appeal, in virtual form. Christian Education reported that Sidewalk Sunday School has begun and was well-received and will continue. Outdoor Tuesday LYFE Sunday School is underway. CUFF reported that a virtual bingo fellowship event is being planned and additional virtual events are being considered. Growth reported that community outreach efforts addressing ongoing conditions are being considered. Human Needs reported that PADs will be collecting food donations in October. Vernon Township has been contacted about the Thanksgiving Basket drive. Long-Range Planning reported that live streaming service options continue to be assessed. Personnel reported that retaining lay personnel and staff during the pandemic enabled receipt and forgiveness of the PPP loan. Property reported building use discussions are being pursued. A permit has been submitted to Lincolnshire for some tree removal. Joel is painting walls in the Narthex and continues to monitor property conditions and conduct upkeep tasks. Gardening activities are ongoing, thanks to volunteers. Worship and Music reported outdoor services continue, as well as the recorded service. An email is sent on Sunday morning in the event of inclement weather. Work towards live streaming continues. Youth reported that outreach to youth and families continues and that journals are available for pick up or mailing on request. Old Business: The Task Force continues to meet and plan, monitoring conditions, guidelines, guidance, and congregation considerations. The Council continues to receive updates and unanimously approves of the work of the Task Force. A motion was made and unanimously passed to approve LCNS' proposal for payment of rent through 2020. New Business: The Nominating Committee will begin consideration of incoming Council candidates.

Next council meeting currently is scheduled for October 12th at 7:00 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.


Youth News
