Reopening Update

The Restoring LCHS Task Force has been meeting over the past few weeks to move our congregation forward to the day when we can again worship together in person. The task force has been discerning what worship will look like while following recommendations from the CDC, the Metro Chicago Synod Bishop's Office, and the Restore Illinois guidelines. We are also being guided by Scripture that teaches us to be "our brother's keeper" and inspires us to sacrifice our individual inconvenience for the health and wellbeing of others.

We do not yet have a definitive date for returning to in-person worship, but we hope to start with a few outdoor summer worship services in our parking lot where we can maintain appropriate physical distance and get a feel for some of the new routines we'll be utilizing indoors. We will announce our first service as soon as we are confident we have the needed supplies and strategies in place.

Some of the tasks we've addressed in addition to worship include writing guidelines for outside groups that use our building, e.g., Camp Lincolnshire and the Music Institute; obtaining materials we will need in order to reopen safely (masks, sanitizing stations, contact-free thermometers); and developing strategies for cleaning based on recommendations of the CDC.

Part of the process regarding worship included the congregational survey. Thank you to the 75 respondents who participated. Results follow:

- 49% are unsure about returning to in-person worship or want to wait some time before returning. 30% want to return but have concerns and 21% want to return as soon as possible.
- Over 70% are willing to wear a mask in order to attend worship.
- 70-80% agreed that various expectations for precautions should be taken, and 20% would prefer communion not be offered.
- Over 70% are willing to reserve a space in order to attend an in-person worship service.
- 75% are willing to attend service at a time different from their usual time.
- As for level of screening, over 80% are willing to have temperatures taken before entering the sanctuary; over one-third are willing to answer questions about exposure; and 11% indicated not being comfortable with any level of screening.
- 90% are interested in a seated outdoor worship service; and 46% are interesting in having a drive-up communion offered.
- For parents with children, 75% are not yet comfortable with having their children attend Sunday School classes and two-thirds or more indicated they preferred most of the precautions be in place for Sunday School classrooms.

A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

In a year where so many things have upset our normal rhythm and many of us have to continue to check what day it is, even what month it is, Independence Day is upon us, and a time to reflect on the wonderful, yet turbulent history of our great nation.

When the Declaration of Independence was signed, on July 4th, 244 years ago, its words described the beginning of a process, not the end. It was a Declaration of Incompleteness.

"We hold these truths to be self-evident," wrote Thomas Jefferson, "that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

"The pursuit of happiness", that phrase alone shows us that our work is never finished.

On this Independence Day, it's appropriate for us, as Christians in the United States of America, to look at where we've been and where we're going. Sixty years ago, it wasn't at all that clear that "all men are created equal" because segregation was enforced in many parts of our country. Black men and women were treated as second-class citizens. It took a massive civil-rights movement to outlaw racial discrimination and move us closer to a society in which all people are accepted as equals.

But are we there yet? Well, not quite. Some might say, not even close.

Notice how theological the Declaration of Independence is on this point: "all men are created equal." It doesn't say born equal — it says created equal. Creation requires a divine Creator, and as Christians we believe that "God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them" (Genesis 1:27).

This anniversary is the perfect day to look at ourselves as people created in the image of God, with tremendous intellectual, spiritual and relational gifts. Psalm 8 tells us that the Lord has made human beings "a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor".

That's who we are, according to Scripture. A little lower than God, crowned with glory and honor. And that's who our neighbors are as well: the working-class family from El Salvador across the street, the single mom with three kids in the grocery store, the unwanted child in need of adoption, the wealthy attorney with a broken marriage and a drinking problem. It's time to break out of our categories and caricatures and begin to see each other as equals — as brothers and sisters, created in the image of God.

Only then can we reach out to each other with love and compassion and understanding, accepting each other as the Lord accepts each one of us.

We have much to improve on when it comes to equality, service to God, and pursuing happiness in our community, and unless we focus on these goals, we're going to find ourselves living in an increasingly segregated, self-serving, sin-saturated and self-centered society.

So let's move a little closer to becoming a nation where all of God's children can enjoy life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. Let's all work toward healing our wounds, lifting each other up with respect and dignity, and resolving underlying injustices. We can make a difference in the lives of many. It may not be perfect, but completeness and perfection will be found only in a relationship with the One who has created us and called us to be his own.

So until then, we'll continue to declare our incompleteness and pursue happiness for all.

With GivePlus, you can quickly and easily donate to Holy Spirit using your smartphone or tablet. GivePlus is free to use and available for download at the App Store (Apple or Google). Simply download the GivePlus app, search for our church by name (Holy Spirit Lutheran Church) or zip code (60069), and then set up your payment using a debit card or credit card. You can make a one-time payment as a guest user, or create an account to set up recurring donations and view your giving history. You are able to donate to four different funds: General Operating Fund, Building Fund, Hunger Offering, or Holiday Offering. Highlights from June 2020

The monthly Church Council meeting was held via Zoom on June 8th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$39,645 for May (YTD total is \$190,035). Operating expenses were \$32,365 in May (YTD total is \$182,341).

The Pastor's report: The Restoring LCHS Task Force's work is underway. Pastor has been engaging with the Synod and other outside resources regarding reopening guidance and plans, and he has engaged in continuing education. Camp Lincolnshire is preparing to operate its program later this summer, June 29-August 15. Preparation of the church's upcoming year calendar is underway. Christian Education reported that VBS will be modified this summer and in its place an adapted program will be conducted primarily through Zoom meetings and take-home projects, with programming tailored to participant ages. Youth that Jennifer Williams continues to maintain contact and offer Zoom meeting opportunities and she is working on youth involvement in the VBS alternative programming. Fellowship/CUFF reported that consideration is being given to a State-compliant fellowship activity later in the summer. **Growth** reported on a free app under consideration offered by the provider of the GivePlus app that serves as a communications hub. Human Needs reported that another food drive is being planned and more information will be circulated. Alternatives to a traditional blood drive in light of the pandemic also are being considered. **Personnel** reported that Kathy Roderer is on payroll as permanent accompanist. Property reported that maintenance tasks and upkeep are ongoing with invaluable member assistance, including addressing a water leak and grounds-keeping. Worship & Music reported that online services will continue with increasing engagement. **Old Business:** The Synod Convention will be Saturday, October 3, 2020, with details to be provided by the Synod at a later date. The Capital Campaign continues. Pledges over \$312,000 have been received, and over \$100,000 in initial gifts have been made. A portion of these gifts will be used to make a \$25,000 prepayment on the mortgage, with the possibility of an additional prepayment upon assessment of projected upcoming capital expenditures, such as HVAC system components. Camp Lincolnshire is being very transparent, engaged, and thorough in monitoring and implementing pandemic-related requirements as it prepares to hold camp later in the summer. The Restoring LCHS Task Force is assessing applicable guidelines for beginning in-person worship, including possible options for outdoor worship later in the summer and then for resuming indoor worship. Recorded worship services will continue, and planning is underway to live stream services.

Next council meeting currently is scheduled for July 13th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.


