National Day of Prayer Service

May 2 at 7:30 PM

Holy Spirit will be joining the many churches around our country that will be observing the National Day of Prayer. The theme for this year is "Love One Another" and in our worship service we will center on prayer; for our country, our churches, our families, our diversity, and that the love of God will bring about a spiritual awakening in America.

Although days of prayer and fasting have been observed throughout our nation's history, the annual spring date of the first Thursday in May was established by President Harry Truman in 1952. Each year since its inception, the president has signed a proclamation, encouraging all Americans to pray on this day.

We are encouraging you to join us for a special worship service and to pray for our country to "Love One Another". Pick up a brochure in the Narthex to learn more about this day dedicated to prayer.

A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

What a wonderful celebration of Christ's resurrection we had this past Easter Sunday! It was wonderful to have so many gathered to celebrate the victory of our God with triumphant music and shouts of praise, as we all gathered to receive Christ's presence at the communion table.

As we celebrate the joy of the season and Christ's triumph over sin, death and the devil, we enter into a period best known as "The Great 50 Days" of Easter. Many of us know that the season of Lent has 40 days to remember how Jesus endured temptation for 40 days in the wilderness, and how we are invited into a period of discipline and fasting and reflection as well. Its intention is to facilitate and reinforce our conviction and devotion to Christ. But many don't about the 50 day season that follows.


The number seven was highly revered among Jews, for seven implied fullness. On the seventh day of creation God celebrated the fullness of all created things. The number came to be enshrined in the time period known as a week. But if seven was a good number, how much better must be 49 (seven squared). So a 49 day period was a "week of weeks". Just as one seventh of the week is set aside as holy, so also one seventh of the year (or as close as we can come to it in even weeks) is held in special regard in a similar way.

Easter is not one closing day at the end of a lengthy period of Lent. Easter is one extended period of rejoicing in the resurrection that more than exceeds in length, the season of Lent. The first day of the season, Easter Day, is the opening of a long-drawn-out celebration, even as the Resurrection is itself, the opening of a vast new reality. Throughout this sacred season we are inspired by Scripture that witness to the many appearances of the risen Christ, and the response by those moved by the Holy Spirit in the Acts of the Apostles. And like those first witnesses to the resurrection, we too are invited to see the world in a whole new light, not for just one day, but for an incredible "Great 50 Days". I pray that during these seven weeks of Easter that you might experience new possibilities, entertain new visions and dreams, and dwell in the hope of an enlightened and transformed new world. Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!

Thank you to all who participated in all our mid-week Lenten services, fellowship events, and special services leading through Holy Week to Easter. Your efforts produced an inspired spirit-filled season filled with meaningful worship and good fellowship, all of which resulted in the continuing building up of our church. It is an example of being united in mission, to see so many gather together to worship, practice music, prepare meals, work on the property, organize the services, and share in the joy that belongs to the children of God. Our church has a lot of Good News to share with our community. May we continue to celebrate the Spirit of our Risen Lord in the glorious weeks to come.

Highlights from April 2019

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on April 8th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$50,323; YTD total is \$113,430. Operating expenses were \$41, 547; YTD total is \$117,727.

The Pastor's report: Visitation ministers were commissioned. LCNS lease renewal is expected to be signed soon. National Day of Prayer is May 2, and the Prayer Group will lead a service. Church Council members' Sunday talks and clipboard circulation seem to be aiding volunteerism.

Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Worship & Music reported that Lenten suppers and Wednesday services were well attended and well received, and the committee prepared for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter services. Christian Education Tuesday LYFE completed working on LENT. Sunday School has stepped way from its usual leaflet/video prepared curriculum for special lessons. Jennifer planned and conducted our Children's Good Friday Service. Our World Hunger Sunday Children's Ministry collected funds sufficient to purchase 90 chicks from the ELCA agricultural program. VBS promo has begun and a google registration form is being prepared. May 5 between services will be an end of year Sunday School celebration. Growth sent out approximately 500 cards to area residents who are new to the community, inviting them to Lenten and Easter services. We have had several visitors in recent weeks. Our banner was up in the Lincolnshire village kiosk. C.U.F.F. The Progressive Dinner is scheduled for Saturday, May 4; host homes are needed and sign up is posted in the narthex. Kymm is in contact with Tennagua for the picnic. Long Range Planning continues with meetings to discuss options for flooring, worship space, and worship service technology/sound. Stewardship Clipboards seem to be increasing stewardship activity. Offering envelope strategies and alternative giving options are being explored. Youth hosted Experiential Stations of the Cross on Wednesday, April 10. The youth survey is being rolled and a link is in the newsletter. Colin plans to hold an informational meeting for future Crossroads parents on May 5 after second service. **Property** reported a successful work day; almost all tasks were completed. The next work day will occur on Saturday, May 4. The roofing project tentatively is scheduled to begin on May 21 and is expected to last 2-3 weeks. **Human** Needs The final PADS session of this season occurred. Continued congregation support of the Messiah PADs sight is under review, as a new coordinator is needed along with staffing needs.

Old Business: An ALICE Training workshop, open to all members, will be conducted on April 28 at noon. The Sanctuary Enhancements Task Force has requested input regarding flooring. Council discussed various options and recommended that the task force explore options that do not involve tearing up the existing flooring. A motion passed to participate in the Buffalo Grove PRIDE parade on Sunday, June 2. Some members also have expressed interest in participating in the Lincolnshire July 4 parade.

New Business: Lutheran Day Nursery will visit on Thursday, June 27, and Donna will post a sign up. COOL Golf Outing is Friday July 12 at Bonnybrook. Security cameras provided by the new internet provider are being considered.

Next council meeting is May 13 at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.




Summer Choir
