A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

During the past couple months as we've been staying home to prevent the spread of this contagious coronavirus, there are plenty of things that we miss. The opportunity to gather with friends, to eat at restaurants, and to gather to worship are among the many activities we've had to refrain from. Even at home our activities have been altered, and I really miss being able to watch sporting events with everything being suspended.

But one bright spot that I have enjoyed during our seclusion, was reliving the glory years of the Chicago Bulls and Michael Jordan in the series "The Last Dance". Sometimes in looking back, we might think that the Bulls simply dominated the 90's, but in recapping those glory years, the series illustrated how each year was an incredible struggle. There were so many worthy opponents in Magic Johnson, Isaiah Thomas, Patrick Ewing, Clyde Drexler, Charles Barkley, Reggie Miller, and Karl Malone. The competition was intense, and the mental stress that the team had to endure was incredible. The star of the show, Michael Jordan, retired twice due to the personal stress, the anguish of losing his father, and the physical and mental toll he experienced. And yet you have to love the dogged perseverance and determination he placed on himself to be the best he could be, for himself, the team, and even the city of Chicago. Michael simply would not be denied, and the whole world fell in love with his charisma for winning.

When sports teams are faced with an uphill battle, as an underdog verses their opponent, the Biblical story of David and Goliath is often referred to. Of course, Goliath was the gigantic Philistine warrior that taunted and challenged anyone to face him in single combat – mano a mano – but no one dared to go and face this monster. Then David, probably only a teenager at the time, goes out to meet him with just 5 smooth stones and a sling, and the rest as they say, is history, as David slays the giant with one precise strike.

Oftentimes when we look at a problem, we're apt to make a giant out of it and consider all the ways that it can defeat us. The more we focus on that person or that issue, the bigger it seems to grow in our minds. The reality, however, is that the solution to the problem begins with identifying the source of the fear. Ultimately, the only thing we can ever control is ourselves and our reaction to a particular problem. In any given situation we need to ask, "What is pushing my buttons or causing my fear?" Once we identify what's going on that makes us tremble, we can then deal with the problem.

Whatever problem we are facing, we also have to recognize that we have some experience to draw upon. Where have you faced such an issue in the past? How were you delivered? How did God intervene to help? And if this particular Goliath is outside of your realm of expertise, then don't hesitate to bring in someone with the relevant experience to help, be it a counselor, a friend or another expert. Ask God to bring you a team of people to provide you with their experience.

People of God know that God can take any situation, even the most negative, and work it out for his glory. David believed that truth throughout his life, even in the dark days when he wrestled with the results of his own sin. He presented what he had that day in facing Goliath: himself, his trusted weapons, but even more, his faith in God. He trusted God for the results and God delivered.

The Goliaths in our lives present a formidable challenge, but we don't have to face them alone. God is with us, and while we should do our best to prepare to slay these giants, we ultimately trust God for the result, knowing that whatever happens will be for his glory.

In response to the official guidelines by our state and health authorities we have suspended all formal worship services and large gatherings until further notice.

Though person-to-person visits will not be available, a network of contact has already been established to provide wellness checks with all members, solicit volunteers to help with providing assistance efforts, and continued contact from staff and members as we explore ways to connect with each other and the ministries of our church.

Receive Offerings for Continued Ministry

You may choose to mail your offerings in, drop off your offering, or sign up or continue to use Simply Giving, our pre-authorized automatic withdrawal program, to contribute to the church, world hunger, COOL food bank, LSSI, or Lutheran World Relief, for we recognize our need to sustain these vital ministries.

Continue to Gather as a Community

Through teleconferencing platforms like ZOOM, we will continue to meet with each other. The church council, prayer group and our capital campaign team have already utilized this technology so that we can continue to work together and be the church we are called to be.

Be a Community Committed to Prayer

Our relationship with God centers on our ongoing communication with God through prayer. As we learn of the many needs of people who need our prayer and lift them up in prayer, we also receive comfort, peace, hope, and inspiration as we experience the abundance that comes from God, and grow in our relationship with God through prayer.

Federal Government Loan

We are pleased to announce that Holy Spirit has received a \$35,237 loan through the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), a program established by the federal government to help small business keep their employees on the payroll. Holy Spirit has retained all of our staff members throughout the COVID19 pandemic, and this loan will help ensure we can continue to pay them while we work to re-establish our worship and ministries in line with the state guidelines. The loan will be used for expenses allowed by the federal guidelines, and we therefore expect the loan will be forgiven later this year. Simply download the GivePlus app, search for our church by name (Holy Spirit Lutheran Church) or zip code (60069), and then set up your payment using a debit card or credit card. You can make a one-time payment as a guest user, or create an account to set up recurring donations and view your giving history. You are able to donate to four different funds: General Operating Fund, Building Fund, Hunger Offering, or Holiday Offering. Community Outreach

What can I do to help others during the pandemic?

The organizations that we support with our hunger offerings and special events need our help now more than ever! Please mail in your hunger offering to church just as you would have contributed on the second Sunday of the month.

PADS (**Providing Advocacy, Dignity, and Shelter**) During the shelter order in Illinois, PADS is not able to use churches or other facilities to shelter residents who are experiencing homelessness. At this time, over 100 individuals are being housed temporarily in hotels and are in need of food and basic supplies each day. PADS is seeking donations of microwaveable food and pantry items to be distributed to the guests staying in hotels. Please prayerfully consider a donation of items on the list below:

COOL Ministries (Community Outreach of Lutherans) COOL is doing their best to keep up with the increased demands of families and individuals in the Lake County area and needs our help. COOL is in need of boxes of cereal, canned vegetables, fresh produce and snacks for the kids home from school (granola bars, fruit snacks, etc). They also need juice (apple, orange, etc). Toiletries are hard to find right now but they can also always use toilet paper, paper towels and household cleaning products as well.

COOL is working in conjunction with PADS to pack meal boxes for their hotel guests so anything microwaveable is also great as well as **plastic silverware**, **cups**, **plates etc. Can openers** are also needed. Monetary donations are always needed, and can be mailed to: COOL Ministries, 800 W. Glen Flora Ave., Waukegan, IL 60085.

Holy Spirit will have a special physically-distanced PADS and COOL drop off on Saturday, May 9, from 1 - 3PM. Please bring your donations to our parking lot at 30 Riverwoods Road in Lincolnshire. You can put them directly into the trunk of a car, and they will be delivered to the PADS and COOL offices.

Holy Family School was forced to cancel their fundraising benefit scheduled for April 25. Their outstanding teachers have moved to e-learning in a community where many families do not have internet access. A Herculean effort has secured Chromebooks and iPads for their students. Temporary internet access has been donated to enable students in preschool through 8th grade to continue their education. However, many of the students lack basic school supplies. Highlights from May 2020

The monthly Church Council meeting was held via Zoom on May 11th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$51,447 for April (YTD total is \$150,390). Operating expenses were \$42,264 in April (YTD total is \$149,976).

The Pastor's report: Members who had been unable to attend in-person services have been enjoying our online services. Online or streaming worship will continue in the future, even after in-person services resume. Pastor Tim has been participating in a wide variety of virtual meetings with the Synod, other churches, members, and church committees. Camp Lincolnshire currently is interested in holding camp from late June into mid-August. VBS scheduling and programming can be flexible to accommodate. Discussion will continue in light of evolving circumstances and guidelines. Worship & Music reported that online services will continue with increasing engagement. Christian Education reported that Jennifer is staying connected with families to keep the Sunday School students and LYFE participants engaged and feeling cared for. Finance reported that electronic and alternative giving methods have been implemented and have been valuable in assisting with collection of benevolence offerings during this time. We have received a federal Paycheck Protection Program loan, which should be forgivable based on federal guidelines. **Growth** reported on the purchase of 2 large signs for the front of the church on Riverwoods Road, inviting neighbors to worship with us online, and that Lincolnshire has left our banner in the village kiosk. Our Deerfield Farmers' Market event in July has been cancelled by the Market committee due to COVID-19. Human Needs reported that the May 9 food drive was a tremendous success, contributing to COOL and PADs. A registry has been set up for Holy Family school to provide needed items, and many items already have been donated. ELCA World Hunger is very appreciative of our continued support. **Personnel** reported that Kathy Roderer officially will start employment in June and will need to complete necessary paperwork. Property reported that maintenance tasks and upkeep are ongoing, including HVAC routine maintenance and repair. Old **Business:** The Synod Convention will be Saturday, October 3, 2020, with details to be provided by the Synod at a later date. The Capital Campaign is proceeding, with circulation of written materials and a video; pledges over \$169,000 have been received thus far. Bible Study and Prayer Group are meeting virtually. National Day of Prayer was conducted virtually, and well-being calls continue. New Business: Camp Lincolnshire has expressed interest in changing camp dates, as discussed in the Pastor's Report. A Reopening Task Force is being convened to consider reopening plans and options, considering applicable requirements and guidelines, and available resources. The Synod also is conducting meetings and is expected to provide guidelines to congregations. We will plan to proceed with the November Boutique, modifying as needed as circumstances evolve. The Lutheran Day Nursery visit originally scheduled in June will not proceed due to the pandemic. The Church picnic scheduled for June will be postponed and hopefully will be rescheduled for later in the summer.

Next council meeting currently is scheduled for June 8th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.


