A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

The season of Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit is present in our lives and in the life of our church. During the season of Pentecost the color we adorn our worship space with is green, signifying growth. That certainly doesn't mean that we are not to grow in our faith at other times of the year, but as we enter into the summer, with the school year ending and vacation on many people's minds, we are reminded that as disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to continue to grow in our faith whatever the season.

There is a story about a little boy who fell out of bed. When his Mom asked him what happened, he answered, "I don't know. I guess I stayed too close to where I got in."

It can be easy to do the same thing with our faith. It's tempting to stay where we got in and never move. So it's important for us to consider how we have grown in our faith. Ask yourself this: How does our prayer life today compare with a few years ago? How about our giving? Have both the amount and our joy increased? What about our church loyalty? Can we tell whether we've grown? And Bible study? Are we learning to learn? Scripture tells us:

"Let us leave the elementary teachings about Christ and go on to maturity." (Hebrews 6:1)

"Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation." (1 Peter 2:2)

"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." (2 Peter 3:18)

Growth is a goal of the Christian. Maturity is mandatory. If a child ceased to develop, the parent would be concerned. Doctors would be called. Tests would be run. When a child stops growing, something is wrong. When a Christian stops growing, help is needed, and a good place to start is by looking at our habits.

There are four habits that we can practice this summer to increase our faith and grow in our relationship with God. One habit is prayer. "Base your happiness on your hope in Christ. When trials come endure them patiently; steadfastly maintain the habit of prayer." (Romans 12:12) The best way to deepen our connection to God is to pray. Don't prepare to pray, just pray. Don't read about prayer, just pray. Don't think that there are special rules or procedures that we have to learn, just pray. Pray, pray, pray, and pray.

Another habit is study. "The man who looks into the perfect law...and makes a habit of so doing, is not the man who hears and forgets. He puts that law into practice and he wins true happiness." (James 1:25) By dwelling in the word of God, we grow in understanding and are formed into what God is calling us to truly be. Find a good devotional, join a Bible study group, make the Bible a habit we're accustomed to.

A third habit is giving. "On every Lord's Day each of you should put aside something from what you have earned during the week, and use it for this offering. The amount depends on how much the Lord has helped you earn." (1 Corinthians 16:2) We don't give for God's sake. We give for our sake. "The purpose of tithing is to teach you to always put God first in your lives." (Deuteronomy 14:23) When we grow in our willingness to give, we grow in our reliance and trust in God.

The fourth habit is the habit of fellowship. "Let us not give up the habit of meeting together, as some are doing. Instead let us encourage one another." (Hebrews 10:25) We all need to be in relationship with others and at some point we will all need support. Take the time to develop some new relationships this summer and make it a habit of encouraging the friends we already have. Jesus came to give us a living example of God's love, so let's share that love and give testimony to our faith in Him.

Growth is a good thing, and I look forward to seeing our church grow and build each other up in spirit and in love. My prayer is that we will all have a spirit-filled summer and that by our habits we may share more fully in the love and joy of God.

Highlights from May 2019

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on May 13th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$88,707; YTD total is \$202,137 (including roof repair donations). Operating expenses were \$34,080; YTD total is \$151,807) (not including roof repair).

The Pastor's report: Easter week, Youth-led Stations of the Cross, and the Prayer Group-led National Day of Prayer services were well-attended and well-received. ALICE training was very well-attended and informative. Colin Pilkington resigned as Youth Ministry Director, and planning for his replacement is underway with Youth and Personnel. Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Worship & Music reported that the committee met to discuss and plan special Confirmation, Music Sunday, and Pentecost services. Monday evening services will begin on June 3 and summer schedule begins on May 26 (one Sunday service at 9:30). Christian Education reported that LYFE and Sunday School have concluded for the school year. VBS promo and planning have begun, and a registration link is on the church website. Finance is assessing reamorization options and will present a proposal at an upcoming meeting. C.U.F.F. The Progressive Dinner was held on May 4 and was a great success. Thanks to all hosts and the caterer for hospitality and delicious food. The next CUFF event is the church picnic at Tennaqua Swim and Racquet Club on June 23, 12-3 pm. Long -Planning continues with meetings to discuss options for flooring, worship space, and worship service technology/sound, as well as visits to other churches for information and ideas. Stewardship is exploring offering envelope strategies and alternative giving options. Youth has received valuable insights from the online survey. Please share your opinions if you have not already done so. A meeting was held on May 5 to discuss future planning and a new youth ministry director. A cook-out/picnic will be held on June 2 after service and the BG parade. **Property** reported a successful work day; almost all tasks were completed. The roofing project tentatively is scheduled to begin the week of May 27. **Human Needs** will advise PADs that we continue to support PADs and can offer to be a source of food donations and volunteers but no longer will be primarily responsible for monthly staffing and donations.

Old Business: An ALICE Training workshop, open to all members, was conducted on April 28. The Sanctuary Enhancements Task Force continues its work. Lutheran Day Nursery will visit on Thursday, June 27, and Donna will post a sign up. A sign up will be posted for the Buffalo Grove pride parade. The congregation will participate in the Lincolnshire July 4 parade. Columbarium Committee positions have been filled. Twenty-eight gifts totaling \$64,000 have been donated to the roof repair fund; many thanks to all who donated. A member graciously has offered to serve as a COOL board member.

New Business: A Thrivent representative is needed; please see the newsletter for further information. A Mutual Ministry Committee has been constituted as provided in the Constitution and will begin to meet.

Next council meeting is June 10th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the narthex.




Summer Choir
