

# A Note from Our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

As Thanksgiving comes and goes, once again many of us find ourselves racing against time to put together the perfect Christmas. Between holiday parties and trips to the mall there are cookies to be baked, lights to be hung, guest rooms to be cleaned, holiday meals to be planned, cards to be addressed, and the perfect gift to be found. And so it begins. The joy and wonder of the season quickly becomes overshadowed if not completely lost by the exhausting quest to make every detail just right.

How foolish to think that the joy of Christmas is found only when every last thing meets our grand expectations. If that were the criterion, then the first Christmas surely would have been considered a disaster. Mary probably hadn't planned on going into labor during her trip to Bethlehem. Far from the comfort of her home and family, she no doubt was distraught to learn that there was no room for them in the inn. Delivering her precious baby in a smelly stable and laying him in an animal's feeding trough was certainly not the way in which the Son of God should enter the world. Or was it?

The joy of Christmas is not found in buying the perfect gift or preparing the perfect meal even if we do receive satisfaction in accomplishing it. The joy of Christmas is found in receiving the perfect gift of Immanuel – God with us. So no matter how our plans turn out this year the important thing is that our Savior was born!

And the joy of Christmas is always new each year. There is a difference between pleasure and joy. C.S. Lewis puts it very clearly in one of his books when he writes, "Joy is never within our power, but pleasure often is." We're like children faced with presents under the tree. Do we tear into them all at once, in a mad frenzy that will be over as quickly as it began, with only a pile of torn wrapping paper and dismembered bows to show for it? Or do we hang back, watching for the right cues, waiting for the unexpected joys to be revealed to us?

The very definition of joy, according to Lewis, is that it is unexpected. Lewis entitles his autobiography, "Surprised by Joy". That's because his personal journey to Christianity was a journey away from aimless pleasure-seeking and towards joy. We must learn to let go of our fears that pleasure is all there is, and learn to trust God to give us those gifts of joy that come to us so unexpectedly, beyond our deserving.

Joy surprises. That is its very nature. You can't capture joy any more than you can capture the wind – yet, there are plenty of people trying to bottle it and sell it to us.

My hope and prayer for you this Advent and Christmas season is that you allow yourself to and be open to God's fascinating way of revealing his love to us, and that you experience unexpected, delightful, and incredible joy! Joy to the world! The Lord is come!

# **Angel** Tree

One of the most rewarding Christmas activities around Holy Spirit is the sharing of gifts with inner city children. Each year, WELCA receives the names of children for whom we purchase gifts at Christmas. Many times, these are the only gifts children will receive. These children have come to be called our "angels".

The "Angel Tree" in the Narthex is adorned with the names of children that we have received from Winthrop Children's Center and Lutheran Day Nursery in Chicago. We ask that you follow the steps for selecting a name and then purchase the appropriate items as recommended. We strive to provide each child with an age appropriate toy, an article of warm clothing (like a hat, mittens, sweater, etc.) and a new or gently used book. Be sure to properly label all your gifts when you return them by **December 15th** so that they are delivered to the right child. Even if you only make an offering once a month you need to pick up your box since the numbering of the boxes enables us to properly assign and credit your contributions. Simply Giving electronic transfers provides you with stickers to place on your envelopes if you choose to use them on any given Sunday.

#### **Tax Time Cometh**

While we are still many months away from April 2020, the end of the year is approaching rapidly. You may want to consider contributing some shares to Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit.

Stocks that you have held for a long time and that have very low basis cost may be especially attractive as charitable gifts. Stock gifts have double value because they often avoid capital gains tax and they result in an income tax deduction for charitable gifts.

Few people contribute to the church just for the tax advantages yet it is a consideration for when you might want to make a contribution. As you look toward the end of the year and the special needs of our church budget, you might consider the timeliness of certain contributions now. Please be sure that if you make a transfer to the church, you notify our office so we can be sure all is completed in an orderly manner and proper credit is received.

# Highlights from November 2019

The monthly Church Council meeting was held on November 11th. Treasurer's report included monthly Benevolence offerings and other income of \$41,642 for October (YTD total is \$401,211). Operating expenses were \$47,963 in October (YTD total is \$460,993).

The Pastor's report: We joyfully welcomed new members in the past month. We have had some major events in the past month as we head into the holiday season, with tremendous support from volunteers-many thanks to all. The interfaith Thanksgiving service will be held at Makom Solel in Deerfield. Committees of the council provided reports of various activities. Property reported that snowplowing has begun and the grounds are prepped for winter. The focus of the November 16 work day was on the interior due to weather. Stewardship reported on the Stewardship appeal and catered celebration meal on November 17, with stewardship pledge cards filled out and presented at the altar during the worship service. Youth reported on a successful Thanksgiving basket drive. The next activity is Hanging of the Greens on December 1. Worship & Music reported on a successful October 20 concert benefitting AMMPARO. The music ministry is planning for holiday worship services. November 24 is Jazz service. Taize services are on Wednesday nights in December. November 17, 24, and December 1 are one-service Sundays, at 9:30 am. Thanksgiving Day service is at 9:30. Christian Education reported on a great Trunk or Treating event, LYFE service at Bernie's Book Bank, a great sales at the Holiday Boutique. The children are preparing for the Christmas program. Advent wreath making is on December 1 after the service, as well as Hanging of the Greens and a holiday children's ministry activity. Finance reported that the anticipated mortgage reset will occur in January, rate to be announced by Thrivent. Growth reported that volunteers will gather on Tuesday, Dec 3, to address postcards inviting church visitors and residents new to the community to join us for Christmas services. There are several new families who are beginning to attend as they accompany their confirmation-aged children to services. Human Needs reported that plans continue for a Christmas outreach program. Long-Range Planning reported that Sanctuary reflooring planning is in progress. **Personnel** reported that responses to insurer requests have been submitted. Old Business: The holiday boutique and bake sale was held on November 3; thanks to all who participated and assisted. WELCA planned a new home shower for Maria on November 14. The holiday white elephant gathering will be held on December 12. The search continues for a new WELCA coordinator. The Nominating Committee is working on a slate. New Business: Preliminary discussion of the 2020 budget.

Next council meeting is December 9th at 7:30 PM. All council meetings are open to Holy Spirit members. Minutes and reports of the council are kept in a public notebook in the Narthex. Annual reports are due to Laurie by Dec. 27th.


